

## Cultural Information – Aglaonema (ag-lay-oh-NEE-muh)

Light:	Partial sun, an eastern or western exposure.
Temperature:	Maintain indoor temperatures above 65°.
Humidity:	Tolerant to a wide range of humidity.
Watering:	Bring to visual dryness between watering and then thoroughly saturate until some water trickles from the bottom of the pot.
Fertilizer:	Low levels of fertilizer. Feed monthly during the active growing season with a dilute soluble fertilizer or top dress lightly with an organic granular.
Pruning:	Little pruning is needed older leaves can be removed if unsightly. Very old plants can be pruned back to half their sized if becoming too large. Best to do this when in active growth.
Insects and Disease:	Few problems with insect with the exception of mealy bugs. Can have difficulties with root disease is kept to wet. Allow a period of dryness between watering.
Comments	Known as the Chinese Evergreen the Aglaonema is a time tested indoor plant that adapts easily to the modern home environment. For the best growth, give it a bright window with a little morning or late afternoon sun if possible.
