

Cultural Information- Ananas (ah-NAN-us)

Light:	Full to partial sun, a southern, eastern or western exposure.
Temperature:	Maintain temperatures above 60-65°.
Humidity:	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate low levels of humidity for a short time.
Watering:	Bring soil to a state of visual dryness between waterings then saturate the soil with water and let it run through the bottom of the pot. Don't dry out too much.
Fertilizer:	They are light feeders, mix ½ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water and feed once a month with a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or 7-9-5.
Pruning:	Once the fruit has ripened to a golden color, you can remove the edible fruit. The central plant remains and young shoots will come off the base. Once the offshoots mature, another fruit will appear.
Insects and Disease:	Resistant to most diseases. If kept too cold, they can get root rot.
Comments:	If multiple shoots come off the main stem you can divide up into several plants.
