<u>Cultural Information- Anthurium</u> (an-THUR-ee-um)

<u>Light:</u>	Partial sun to shade, an eastern, western, or northern exposure.
Temperature:	Maintain indoor temperatures above 60°.
Humidity:	They are tolerant of wide swings in humidity, doing equally well in a dry winter home or a humid conservatory.
Watering:	A little dryness to the soil between watering is beneficial. Try not to put into a severe wilt.
Fertilizer:	As they are often grown in lower light conditions, a monthly application of a balanced fertilizer is all that is needed. Too much fertilizer under lower light will cause foliage burn.
Pruning:	Old flower stems can be removed and leaves that might get damaged; however, they generally don't need pruning.
Insects and Disease:	They are not bothered much by either insects or diseases.
Comments:	Anthuriums are easy plants to grow and a great choice for low light conditions. If flowering varieties don't bloom easily then increase the light level.
