

## Cultural Information – Athyrium (uh-THEE-ree-um)

Light:	Shade, a northern exposure is best.
Temperature:	Maintain temperatures above 35° in a container. When planted in the ground, they are hardy to zone 4. They will do best as garden plants where they survive in subfreezing temperatures.
Humidity:	As garden plants humidity is not an issue although relative humidity is best to be above 50%.
Watering:	Even moisture to slightly dry although once established they can tolerate fairly severe dryness and still do well.
Fertilizer:	Go easy on fertilizer. When planted in the ground, little if any fertilizer is needed.
Pruning:	Old, damaged, or dying fronds can be removed as needed.
Insects and Disease:	Few problems with insects or diseases.
Comments	Athyriums are excellent candidates for the shaded garden. Once established they can thrive for years with little attention.
