

Cultural Information – Chusquea (chus-KWEE-uh)

Light:	Full sun, a southern exposure is best.
Temperature:	Hardy to temperatures down to 0 degrees when planted in the ground. In containers, keep temperatures above freezing.
Humidity:	Humidity is not an issue.
Watering:	Even moisture. Be sure the soil has good drainage.
Fertilizer:	Moderate fertilizer needs. Top dress with an organic granular several times during the growing season. Restrict fertilizer in mid to late summer to allow growth to harden off.
Pruning:	Little pruning is needed except for an occasional unsightly old cane. Canes can be pruned back some if height becomes an issue.
Insects and Disease:	Few if any problems with insects or diseases.
Comments	Chusquea are dramatic bamboos for the garden and although clumping in habit, they have a little more of a spreading habit than others. They do make a good potted plant although one needs to have sufficient room in the container and growing space for them to develop.
