<u>Cultural Information- Cuphea</u> (KYOO-fee-uh)

Light:	Full sun, a southern exposure.
Temperature:	Maintain indoor temperatures above 50°.
Humidity:	Best to maintain humidity above 50% although it will tolerate lower levels without harm.
Watering:	Bring the soil to visual dryness between waterings and then thoroughly saturate.
Fertilizer:	Moderate to heavy feeder under warmth and high light. Feed with a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or lower at regular intervals through its active growing season.
Pruning:	Pruning can be done at the end of the growing season or in early spring so as not to disrupt the flowering cycle.
Insects and Disease:	They are not susceptible to insects; however, excessive heat water and fertilizer in the summer can bring on root problems.
Comments:	Cuphea are great plants for summer flowering, responding to the high light and long days of summer. If flowering stops, it is usually related to the lack of light intensity.
