

## Cultural Information – Dionaea (dy-OH-nee-uh)

Light:	Full sun, a southern exposure.
<u>Temperature:</u>	Maintain a minimum temperature of 35°. They prefer cool night temperatures for two months during the winter to induce a dormant period. Night temperatures in the high 30's to low 40's are ideal. A cool, neglected windowsill is perfect. During active growth, we keep them warm, above 60°, which speeds up growth.
Humidity:	Preferably 50% or higher; however, as they grow in water, humidity is not usually a concern.
Watering:	They are bog plants and need to be kept moist at all times. <u>It's best to grow them in a saucer of water.</u> Also, using non- chlorinated water will improve their growth. Periodically change the water in the saucer to ensure consistent purity.
Fertilizer:	No fertilizer as they prefer low fertility. Too much will harm them!
Pruning:	No pruning is necessary.
Insects and Disease:	For the most part, insects or diseases do not bother them.
Comments	Keep them wet with pure, clean water for best growth. Feeding them flies or hamburger is not necessary and will cause the traps to die.
