<u>Cultural Information – Faucaria</u> (fow-KAR-ee-uh)

<u>Light:</u>	Full or partial sun, a southern, eastern or western exposure.
Temperature:	Maintain indoor temperatures above 40°.
Humidity:	They will tolerate wide swings in humidity with no harm.
Watering:	Bring soil to a state of visual dryness between watering. When watering, thoroughly saturate the soil until a little water runs out of the bottom of the pot. Growing in a clay pot will help maintain a healthy root system. Grow drier during the winter months when temperatures are lower.
Fertilizer:	They are moderate to light feeders; ¼ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water every two weeks using a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15, or a blooming fertilizer like 7-9-5. Stop feeding when not in growth.
Pruning:	They don't need pruning but can be divided when plants are older.
Insects and Disease:	Faucaria have few problems with insects. Mealy bugs occasionally bother them. If kept too wet, rots of both the stems and roots can consume the plants.
Comments	An easy and enduring plant to grow. Good light and a little dryness between watering are essential for success.
