<u>Cultural Information- Humulus</u> (HUM-uh-lus)

<u>Light:</u>	Full sun, a southern exposure.
Temperature:	Maintain indoor temperatures above 32°.
Humidity:	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate low levels with no harm. Do not allow the plant to dry to a severe wilt.
Watering:	Usually grown as an outdoor plant; do not allow it to dry to a severe wilt.
Fertilizer:	Fertilize during active growth with a balanced low-level fertilizer (15-15-15 or lower), ½ tsp .per gallon of water per week.
Pruning:	Prune only at the end of the growing season.
Insects and Disease:	Susceptible to beetles; damage will appear as holes on leaves. At first sign of infestation, treat with Neem Oil or a safe insecticidal soap.
Comments:	Plant takes a year to become established, and needs room to climb and ramble. It is an enduring, hardy vine with hop flowers beginning to ripen mid-August to mid-September. The aromatic, light golden, cone-shaped hops flowers are best for making pale ales, brown ales or UK-style ales, and are also used in teas for insomnia.
