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<u>Cultural Information – Morinda</u> (mo-RIN-duh)

Light:	Full or partial sun, a southern, eastern or western exposure.
Temperature:	Maintain indoor temperatures for potted plants above 40°.
<u>Humidity:</u>	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they can tolerate lower levels with no harm.
Watering:	Bring the soil to a state of visual dryness between waterings. When watering, thoroughly saturate soil until a little water runs out of the bottom of the pot. Do not water again until the soil is visually dry.
Fertilizer:	They are moderate feeders. Fertilize using ¼ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water once a week. Use a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or 7-9-5.
Pruning:	Plants can be pruned as needed. However, the plant grows with a central leader and lateral branches much like a Christmas tree. It is on these lateral branches that the flowers and fruit form so pruning will slow down fruiting. They do take well to pruning when it is needed.
Insects and Disease:	Morinda have few problems with insects or diseases of the foliage and roots.
Comments	Morinda make excellent potted plants producing the Noni fruit easily and at a young age. The more sun, the better and when temperatures are kept above 60° they grow and fruit year-round.
