

Cultural Information – Pandorea (pan-DOH-ree-uh)

Light:	Full sun, a southern exposure.
Temperature:	Minimum indoor temperatures above 40° F; however, they will tolerate low levels periodically.
Humidity:	Preferably 50% or higher; however, they will tolerate low levels without harm.
<u>Watering:</u>	Water when the soil is visually dry. When watering, thoroughly saturate the soil until a little water runs out of the bottom of the pot. Growing in a clay pot will help maintain a healthy root system.
Fertilizer:	Apply monthly or bi-monthly using ½ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water. Use a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or a blooming fertilizer like a 7- 9-5. When active growth stops in winter, discontinue feeding.
Pruning:	Prune as needed or anytime growth is excessive. However, blooms form on the tips of new growth and pruning will slow down blooming. Prune selectively. They respond well to hard pruning.
Insects and Disease:	Resistant to most insects. Not susceptible to diseases.
Comments	Pandorea is a strong growing, free flowering vine that performs best under high light. Although it will bloom most of the year, its blooming cycle is late winter through fall.
