

Cultural Information – Psidium (SIGH-dee-um)

Light:	Full sun, a southern exposure is best.
Temperature:	Maintain indoor temperatures above 60°; however, they will tolerate low levels periodically.
<u>Humidity:</u>	Preferably 50% of higher; however, they will tolerate low levels with no harm.
<u>Watering:</u>	Bring soil to a state of visual dryness between watering. When watering, thoroughly saturate soil until a little water runs out of the bottom of the pot. Growing in a clay pot will help maintain a healthy root system.
Fertilizer:	Go easy on the fertilizer. Apply monthly or bi-monthly using ½ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water. Use a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or a blooming fertilizer like a 7-9-5.
Pruning:	Prune plants after fruit harvest or whenever growth is excessive.
Insects and Disease:	Resistant to most insects; occasional mealy bug problems. They are susceptible to root disease if kept too wet and cool.
<u>Comments</u>	Grow them in a clay pot as an indoor plant. This keeps the root system healthy.
