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<u>Cultural Information – Staghorn Fern- Platycerium bifurcatum</u> <u>In tree fern pot</u>

(plat-ee-SIR-ee-um)

<u>Light:</u>	Partial sun, an eastern or western exposure.
Temperature:	Maintain indoor temperatures above 50° or 60° if active growth is desired.
Humidity:	Preferably 50% of higher; however, they will tolerate low levels with no harm.
Watering:	Water only when the tree fern pot has become light when lifted. The Ponga Pot can be placed in a saucer and watered from the bottom. Once it is saturated, the pot will feel quite heavy.
Fertilizer:	Go easy on the fertilizer. Apply monthly or bi-monthly. Fertilize with ½ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water. Use a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or 7-9-5. Excessive fertilization can create difficulties in culture.
Pruning:	Remove any old fronds that have turned brown, which does happen in time.
Insects and Disease:	Resistant to most insects; scale can be a problem if the plant is exposed to an infected plant. They are susceptible to root disease if kept too wet.
Comments	Staghorn ferns are epiphytes or tree dwellers that need good quality light, that is some direct sunlight during the day and a period of dry potting media between waterings.
