

Cultural Information – Trevesia (tre-VES-ee-uh)

Light:	Partial sun or shade, an eastern, western or northern exposure.
Temperature:	Maintain indoor temperatures above 60°.
Humidity:	Preferably 50% of higher; however, they will tolerate low levels with no harm.
Watering:	Bring soil to a state of visual dryness between watering. When watering, thoroughly saturate soil until a little water runs out of the bottom of the pot. Growing in a clay pot will help maintain a healthy root system.
Fertilizer:	Moderate to light feeders depending on the light level. Apply once a month with ½ tsp of fertilizer per gallon of water. Use a balanced fertilizer like a 15-15-15 or 7-9-5.
Pruning:	Prune when it gets to be a large specimen. Little or no pruning is needed.
Insects and Disease:	Not susceptible to insects but susceptible to root rots under damp conditions.
Comments	Manage moisture so they do not get root disease. We highly recommend growing in a clay pot vs. a plastic pot for long term root health or pay close attention to watering.
